



Liberty Pole Spirits ([more info about the event here](#)), a whiskey distillery in the city of Washington, hopes to sustain the memory of the slowly fading Whiskey Rebellion past. Their brand proudly honors the men and women of southwestern Pennsylvania who stood up for fairness and shaped the future government of the United States.

To commemorate the Whiskey Insurrection of 1791-1794, the distillery crew will join with the community for their annual liberty pole raising **on June 9th, 2018** at 9 p.m. Beginning at 4 p.m., the distillery will be buzzing with special cocktails, live music with artists performing original compositions, food from local restaurants, straight razor shaves by LD's House of Shaves, and distilling demonstrations. Then, at 8:30 p.m., participants will gather at David Bradford's House, 175 S. Main Street, Washington, to join in carrying the pole down the closed streets to the distillery.

In addition, during the day, participants will also have the opportunity to travel the roads of the Whiskey Boys and see the places that shaped our country's history. Inspired and guided by Senator Camera Bartolotta, six locations have been carefully selected to showcase the accomplishments of local businesses and historical associations in an effort to rejuvenate local economies. It is hoped that uniting the communities of southwest PA will assist in preserving and highlighting the history of the Whiskey Insurrection.

Participants will follow a list of addresses in Monongahela, Brownsville, and Scenery Hill that include taverns, museums, and historic locations. Participants are encouraged to travel at their own pace, allowing time to shop or enjoy a delightful lunch or dinner. The day will end around 8:30 p.m. when everyone meets at the Bradford House to join in the parade. A 17-foot liberty pole will be carried down the closed streets, followed by anyone who attends. The pole will then be raised onto the side of the distillery where it will remain until after the Whiskey Rebellion Festival, scheduled for July 5 - 8.
